#### Dear Families and Friends,

We are rapidly heading towards the middle of Term 1, with 6 weeks to go. Our classrooms have been busy finishing their learning of expectations, routines and structures. This week we began our formal learning instruction and it has been so great to see students heavily engaged in their learning. Students are beginning to undertake their phonics and spelling patterns work and we are eager to share some of this with you in the near future.

#### School Council Call for Nominations

On Thursday, each family was sent home a document with two nomination forms.

- 1. Form 3: Self-nomination form for parent member category:

  This form is to be used by parents who would like to nominate themselves for a

  School Council position. This form must be signed by the self-nominating

  parent.
- 2. Form 4: nomination form for parent member category:

  This form is to be used by parents who wish to nominate another parent on behalf of that parent. This form requires that the nominator, have a conversation about nominating the nominate, as they will need to sign the back of this form. This form is also signed by the self-nominating parent.

### Photography, Acceptable ICT and Medical Permissions

On Compass, we have set up an easy process for our families to consent to photography, the use of ICT and Medical Permissions for cooking. This can be done via the parent payments on Compass under voluntary contributions. These permissions MUST be approved by families to ensure that your child can:

- Participate in cooking sessions at school
- Use computers/ipads when undertaking learning and break clubs
- Have their picture taken or be included in video footage to showcase our school, individual work etc

If ALL families could do this by Friday 28<sup>th</sup> February, this would be greatly appreciated. If this does not get completed, please expect a phone call from the school office asking for this do be completed on the spot. Failing to do this will then see your child be excluded from the use of technology, cooking and sharing of their work. If you require support with this, please see Kade or Bec.

#### Year 6 Polo Shirts

Our Year 6 Polo Shirts have been ordered, with students having the opportunity to select a design earlier this week. The cost of these shirts is \$37.95 each. #### Cessation of Reading Eggs

As a school, we have made the decision to move away from the use of Reading Eggs as a Literacy Program for our students. This decision was a difficult one, however we felt that as a school, the program no longer aligns with our teaching of phonics and spelling in a meaningful and sequential way. This will mean that students will lose access to this in the coming days. Parents are able to purchase their own package for their child should they wish.

#### Start Right Program

Over the past two and a half weeks, our students have been engaged in a carefully designed and much needed Start Right Unit of work. The aim of these units has been to:



#### Rationale:

- To support teachers in setting up their classroom environments, having student agency and voice in the process
- To clarify the expected behaviours, roles and responsibilities of both the teacher and student throughout the various elements of our Instructional Models
- To provide teachers with the critical time needed to forge strong rapports with their students
- To increase the motivation and engagement of our students in their learning and provide them with the strategies needed to be successful in their learning throughout 2025

The units have been successful in assisting students to get to know one and other and to help students understand the expectations of our school.

#### Special Assembly

On Friday 28<sup>th</sup> February at 2:15pm, we will be having a special assembly. This assembly will kick off with our normal assembly item and then sort out students into their Sporting Houses. We are excited to kick off our Sports Houses, where students can compete in sporting events and demonstrate our school values to earn points for their house. At the end of assembly, parents are welcome to take their children home if they choose.

Let's work together to make our school and local area cleaner and greener!






# **OFPS School Uniforms**


